B.Mus. PROGRAM IN MUSIC PERFORMANCE - AUDITION INFORMATION

DATES

Auditions are usually held on two or three different dates during the fall semester for spring admission, and on two or three dates during the spring semester for fall admission. Dates are announced at the beginning of each semester. Students will be notified by email or phone of the time of the audition. FORMAT

Each audition is about 15 minutes long and held in front of a panel consisting of two or three members of the Music Department faculty. During the audition, keyboard and aural (sight-singing) skills will also be tested.

REPERTOIRE

Audition repertoire for the **B.Mus. in Classical Instrumental or Vocal Performance** should consist of a program of three or four representative works from different style periods; singers should prepare at least one work in a language other than English. **Instrumentalists auditioning for a B.Mus. in Jazz Performance** must include at least one selection that is fully or mostly notated (Note: Hunter College does not have a concentration in Vocal Jazz Performance.) Memorization is recommended, but not required. The applicant should present each of the jurors with a **list of the pieces (not copies of the music)** prepared for the audition, as well as the name and affiliation (if any) of applicant's current private teacher. The audition panel will ask to hear portions of the works prepared. In addition, in order to provide the best possible guidance, we will also test your keyboard and aural (sight-singing) skills as part of the audition.

ACCOMPANISTS

Students are required to provide their own accompanists. Upon request, the Director of Performance will provide names of graduate and undergraduate pianists available to accompany auditions.

DRESS

Students are expected to dress formally (men: coat and tie; women: dress, skirt and blouse, or formal pants outfit).

EVALUATION

Students not accepted into the 60-credit Bachelor of Music program may enroll in the 42-credit Bachelor of Arts music program. They may repeat the audition in a later semester, with the approval of their private instructors, the Audition Panel, and the Director of Performance Studies. Students may not audition for the 60-credit Bachelor of Music program more than twice.
